Bird City Bastrop Field Trips

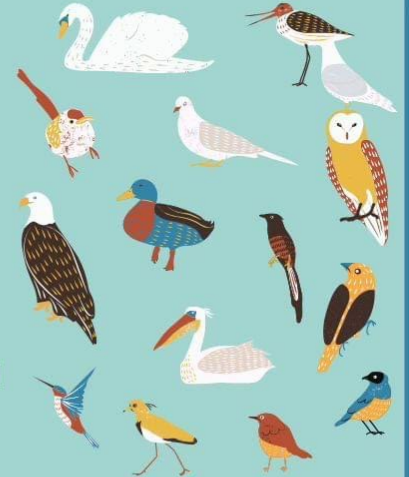
