December Field Trips – Christmas Bird Counts

So, it is that time of year again. Time for the nationwide Audubon Christmas Bird Counts. This year will mark the 119th time the Bird Count has taken place and it represents the nation's longest-running community science bird project.

We have two CBC's occurring in our county. They are the Lost Pines CBC and the Bastrop CBC.

This CBC is in Bastrop County between the Bastrop CBC and Austin CBC circles and just a bit to the north. This count is a community collaboration between the Lower Colorado River Authority, Bastrop Audubon Society and the Lost Pines Master Naturalists. This year the count will take place Saturday, Dec. 29, 2018 and will include the properties of McKinney Roughs, Hyatt Lost Pines, Webberville, Utey, numerous rural areas around Elgin, many area county roads and neighborhoods including Crystal Lake, Bluebonnet Acres, Wilbarger Bend, Union Chapel and Young's Prairie Road. The count also encompasses miles of the lower Colorado River. Count starts on Saturday, Dec. 30 at 6 am at McKinney Roughs Visitor Center. Plan to arrive by 5:30 am to meet up with your count group. Countdown will take place at 6:00 pm at the McKinney Roughs Visitors Center. Register online at

November Field Trip Report



On November 3rd, the Bastrop County Audubon Society held a joint field trip with the Audubon Texas Chapter Assembly at Lake Bastrop. We had a great turn-out with twenty-three birders taking to the field in cloudy 73°F weather.

November is always a transition month for Bastrop County, as the summer birds have left, but it's still a bit early for our winter birds such as sparrows, ducks, towhees, and thrushes. So, the birding was a bit slow as expected, but spirits were good, bolstered by a large stash of left-over Halloween chocolate.

There were several good sightings during the day. As we arrived at Lake Bastrop's North Shore, a kettle of 25 American White Pelicans were circling overhead, and later in the day we spotted two more. A pair of resident Osprey spent much of the day hovering and diving, proving many good looks, and plenty of photo opportunities. And, a nice bright female Belted Kingfisher was very cooperative later in the day on the South Shore. In total, we recorded twenty-four species for the day.
